6 Steps to a Thesis Statement

1. Name your focus topic

EXAMPLE: The Beverly Hill's Diet

2. Ask a question (make sure it's not obvious!) about your focused topic

EXAMPLE: Is the Beverly Hill's Diet advisable for the typical college student?

3. Revise the question into a declarative statement:

EXAMPLE: The Beverly Hills Diet is inadvisable for the typical college student.

4. Add a group of words summarizing your key ideas EXAMPLE: Because it is inconvenient, unhealthy, and provides only temporary weight loss.

5. Recognize the opposition EXAMPLE: Although it does provide quick weight loss.

6. Call upon editing to put it all together

EXAMPLE: Although it does provide quick weight loss, the Beverly Hills Diet is inadvisable for the typical college student because it is inconvenient, unhealthy, and provides only temporary weight loss.

Intro paragraph

Sentence 1: hook Sentence 2-4: Explain the **entire** quote or argument presented (there might be 2 sides, 2 quotes, so pay close attention!)

Final sentence: Thesis, which shows the extent of your (dis)agreement (follow the 6-step process!)
